When a church reaches out to us, one of the questions they usually ask is, "How much does it cost to get Patch Our Planet to come to our church for training?" Our answer has always been, "Whatever you decide." This position of trust with churches allows our ministry to serve regardless of their size or budget. We believe the Church is the answer to the orphan crisis. Therefore, it is our highest priority to equip, inspire and unite churches in an effort to change the story for every orphan. We love watching the hand of God creatively fund this ministry each year. As the Lord provides, we will continue to operate by faith for the good of every church, community and orphan.



At Patch Our Planet, we equip, unite and inspire church leaders and advocates with a clear and compelling strategy for both local and global orphan care. This is a custom strategy that fits the strengths of each church and works within the church's overall vision. Our approach is a whole-care approach. We plan with clarity and purpose by teaching a church how to wrap around its foster and adoptive families and how to engage the 80-90% of the church who may not have fostered or adopted. By taking this kind of approach, a church is released into their community and wherever they are connected in the world, ready to make a lasting difference in the life of an orphan. By equipping a church, we intentionally get to the root of the orphan care problem by:

- Caring for those in our churches who are fostering or adopting
- Encouraging greater participation in foster care, Safe Families and adoption
- Providing critical resources for parents of children from "hard places"
- Connecting churches with foster/group homes in their region
- Encouraging addiction recovery ministries to serve broken families (closing the front door of foster care)
- Creating effective overseas strategies
